

RULES AND REGULATIONS
GOVERNING
CONGREGATION B'NAI JACOB CEMETERY

- A- For purpose of these resolutions the word "right" means a single or individual grave.
- B- A member is the individual in the convregation who has taken his proper share of responsibility in the synagogue: Who has been paying his assessments and was not more than one year behind in payment of his dues from May 1st, 1957. (LIST HEREWITH ATTACHED)
- C- It is clearly understood and agreed that the rights purchased by each member or individual are for the use of the member, member's wife, member's children or the widow whose husband had been a member of the congregation. These rights may not be sold, transferred or endowed to any other person (except as listed above) without the written consent and authorization of the B'nai Jacob cemetery executive committee.
- D- The congregation may, at its discretion, and if funds are available for the purpose, repossess the "rights" offered for sale by the original purchaser or his family at the buyer's original purchase price.
- E- The cost for members (as outlined in paragraph B) is \$50.00 for each right, if purchase is made in the first three month period after the acceptance of the plan. After the three month period but within one year after acceptance of the plan the cost per right shall be \$75.00. Purchases by members in good standing at the expiration of the one year period shall be subject to review by the congregation, cemetery and executive committee.
- F- The charge for non-members shall be a minimum of \$300.00 per right.

RULES AND REGULATIONS (Cont'd)

In special cases, or in cases of unusual circumstances the rate is subject to review and decision by the congregation cemetery committee.

-G- The initial purchase by members (as listed in paragraph B) is to be a minimum of two.

Plots 73 - 80 inclusive plus plots 83-84-85-86 are reserved as family plots. A family plot is made of 6 rights.

Plots 65-70 and plots 81-82, 87-88 are designated as units of 2 rights or units of 4 rights.

-H- Allocation of space in the congregation cemetery shall be by self selection of the members. In the event of a problem in the matter of selection the matter shall be left for decision to the congregation executive committee. Self selection shall be open to members (as indicated in paragraph B) for a period of three months after acceptance of these resolutions. Beyond the three month period the allocation of rights shall be at the discretion of the congregation cemetery committee. A non-member shall be allocated such space or spaces that are available and allotted by the congregation cemetery committee.

-I- It is understood and agreed that the rules and regulations that govern the operation (and general plan) of the Stamford cemetery laws shall be strictly adhered to in respect to limit of size of stones, stone footings, hedges, shrubs, fences, obstructions, etc.
